**PLEASE READ three books of at least 100 pages** in length. On the first day of school you must submit a book report for each book. Book reports should have the proper heading in the upper right hand corner: Name, Date, Book Report, number of pages. They may be hand-written or typed on your computer. If a computer is used, please use a 12 Pt. Font size and double space. Number of pages your book should be: 100

Follow these directions for completing the report.

TITLE of book needs to be **bold print**. Give the author's name.

PARAGRAPH 1 - give the setting of the story (where and when it takes place) and main characters.

PARAGRAPH 2 – Explain problem or plot in the story and include 3 main events or details that occur.

PARAGRAPH 3 – Solution to the problem (ending).

PARAGRAPH 4 – Your opinion – Did you like the book? Why or Why not.

WRITE DOWN 2 NEW WORDS THAT YOU LEARNED AND THEIR DEFINITIONS
